Dates in History

On October 22nd, the first parachute jump of note was made by André-Jacques Garnerin from a hydrogen balloon 3,200 feet above Paris. Garnerin first conceived of the possibility of using air resistance to slow an individual's fall from a high altitude while a prisoner during the French Revolution. He completed his first parachute in 1797, a canopy 23 feet in diameter and attached to a basket with suspension lines. He died in a balloon accident in 1823 while preparing to test a new parachute.

On October 26th, The Erie Canal opened, 1825 connecting the Great Lakes with the Atlantic Ocean via the Hudson River. Work began on the waterway in 1817, and 83 canal locks were built to accommodate the more than 500 foot rise in elevation. After more than two years of digging, the 363 mile Erie Canal from Albany to Buffalo, was opened by Governor Clinton. The effect of the canal was immediate and dramatic. Settlers poured into western New York, Ohio, Michigan, Illinois and Wisconsin. Goods were transported at one-tenth the previous fee in less than half the time. Barges of farm produce and raw materials traveled east, as manufactured goods and supplies flowed west.

1975 On October 11th, Saturday Night Live (SNL), a topical comedy sketch show featuring Chevy Chase, John Belushi, Dan Aykroyd, Gilda Radner, Garrett Morris, Jane Curtin, and Laraine Newman, made its debut on NBC. The 90-minute program, which from its inception has been broadcast live from Studio 8H at Rockefeller Center, includes a different guest host and musical act each week. The opening sketch of each show ends with one actor saying, "Live from New York, it's Saturday Night!"
